March 14, Keynote Speaker: Graham Saul

"Beyond the Twin Crises of Climate Change and Species Collapse: Restoring Nature in the 21st Century "

Nature Canada is the country's oldest national nature conservation charity. Graham Saul has more than 25 years of experience working on social and environmental justice issues. His background includes five years with Oxfam International in Maputo, Mozambique, and five years in Washington D.C., with the Bank Information Centre - an environmental watchdog and information clearinghouse that monitors the World Bank and other multilateral development banks.

Since returning to Canada in 2004, he has worked as the International Programme Director for Friends of the Earth Canada and Oil Change International, and was the Executive Director of Climate Action Network Canada- a coalition of more than 100 Canadian organizations working together to push for action on climate change.



Graham was a founding member and Executive

Director of Ecology Ottawa, a grassroots environmental organization focused on the City of Ottawa. He believes that in order to build a better world, we need to learn how to build a better city.

Graham received an honours degree in Political Science from McGill University, was a visiting practitioner at Cornell University, and produced the paper "Environmentalists, What are we Fighting for?" as a Metcalf Innovation Fellow.

Kiwanis Festival Top Pianist: Mimi Zhang

Mimi Zhang is a first-year undergraduate student in the Medical Sciences program at Western University. She began piano at the age of four and recently completed her practical exam for her ACCT diploma in piano performance.

Additionally, she has been awarded the David Greenslade Memorial Scholarship from Conservatory Canada for the highest practical exam mark in the academic year for Grade 10 Classical Piano.

Spring Luncheon Speaker - April 18, 2024 - Jennifer Botterill

"Empowering Others to Pursue Excellence"

Jennifer Botterill is one of Canada's most successful athletes. A member of the Canadian Women's Hockey team for 14 years, she is a three-time Olympic champion, CEO of two companies and an in-demand NHL analyst in both Canada and the United States. She regularly appears on CBC's Hockey Night in Canada.

A graduate of Harvard University, she is the only twotime winner of the Patty Kazmaler award, which honors the top player in women's college hockey. Jennifer debuted for the national team in 1997 and was named for the first ever Canadian Olympic women's hockey roster in 1998. Throughout her collegiate career and beyond, Jennifer amassed 17 gold medals for Canada. She is a five-time World Champion, and was named MVP of the World Championships twice.

Jennifer Botterill is the only NHL analyst to appear on



national networks in both Canada and the US. She kicked off her broadcast career in 2011, covering the Women's World Championships for TSN. Since then she has worked with MSG Network, CBC on Hockey Night in Canada and Sportsnet.

In addition, Jennifer is the CEO of Excel in Life Inc. and Journey to Excel Inc., where she continues her pursuit of excellence while inspiring and coaching others.

Paige Peetsma - Youth Focus Speaker

Meet Paige Peetsma, the 10-year-old hockey sensation who embodies the spirit of dedication and passion on the ice. Paige's journey began at the tender age of 2 when she first laced up her skates, setting the foundation for a promising future in hockey.

At the age of 3, Paige fearlessly stepped onto the hockey rink with the boys, showcasing her skills and tenacity. By 4, she not only secured a spot on the boys' select hockey team but was thriving in a league of 6year-olds, a testament to her exceptional talent and determination.

Recognition came early for Paige when, at 7, the Ontario Women's Hockey Association granted her exceptional player status, allowing her to compete at a level two years older. In the face of the challenges posed by the COVID -19 pandemic, Paige's commitment to her craft remained unwavering as she continued to hone her skills on the backyard rink lovingly crafted by her father.

Paige's journey took a significant leap at age 9 when she joined the GTHL's North York Ranger Boys AAA team, where her leadership qualities shone through. In the past season, she was honored with the captaincy, a testament to her influence both on and off the ice.



The summer of 2023 brought another feather to Paige's cap when Sports Illustrated recognized her talents, selecting her for the Boys AAA Prospects All Star Team.

Beyond the hockey rink, Paige is not just an athlete - she is an A student at a French immersion school, reflecting her dedication to her studies.

But that's not all - Paige is on a quest for excellence in martial arts, working towards her Black belt in Karate, showcasing a commitment to discipline and excellence beyond the ice.

With her determination, skill, and well-rounded pursuits, Paige Peetsma is poised to leave an indelible mark on the world of hockey and beyond, following in the footsteps of Canadian sports icons like Jennifer Botterill. Keep an eye on this rising star as she skates towards greatness, leaving an indelible mark on the world of hockey and fulfilling her Olympic dreams.

After careful review of our expenses for the upcoming year, the WCC London Board has set the membership fee for 2024 / 2025 at **\$100.00**. No increase from last year!

Single tickets will increase from \$25.00 to \$30.00. If you purchase a single ticket one month and then wish to take out a full membership, the single ticket purchase will be applied to the membership fee.

- Speaker presentations include a wide variety of informative and entertaining topics. Monthly youth speakers who have an exciting or inspirational personal story to tell and are usually from the greater London area. They vary in age from 5th graders to university students.
- 3 receptions (September, December, February) following the speaker presentations
- You also have the choice of watching virtually, as we livestream 8 events, September to April and provide a YouTube recording for all members.
- Through the Club, you help provide community service to the Food Bank, My Sisters' Place, the Poppy Fund, and through the collection of aluminum tabs, assist in providing specialized wheelchairs to deserving young people.
- As a member, you will be a contributor toward the Kathryn Sells Music Award at the Kiwanis Festival, and toward 4 Emerging Leader Awards that recognize youths' outstanding contributions to the community.
- Each month you can participate in an afternoon of socializing with long-time friends and the making of new ones! The videos and live streaming will continue to offer members an opportunity to watch the speaker when they are unable to attend in person. This is a benefit for those not retired, members who do not live near the venue and for snowbirds! The videos are extremely popular, judging by the number of views.

** Your Board is focusing on new strategies for generating revenue besides membership fees. For example, we obtained a Platinum Sponsorship with TD and a Gold Sponsorship with Western University, organized 4 Silent Auctions and our second Artisans Holiday Market.
